Then a major obstacle appeared in her path: her catering truck broke down and she was told it would need an expensive repair in order to get back on the road. Knowing this repair was necessary to continue providing for her son, she paid for it, but the cost drained her savings and made her unable to pay rent that month. It was time to reach out for help. When Tina called YWCA Greater Pittsburgh, we were able to help her pay rent, giving her the support she needed to keep pursuing her dream and providing for her son.

### **Helping Our Students Reach for the Stars**

In 2022-2023 we gave our STEM Stars students 7 opportunities to connect with mentors and explore potential college and career paths through Saturday Academy field trips to institutions like the Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics and Carnegie Mellon University.

In 2022-2023, we worked closely with the University of Pittsburgh P.R.I.D.E. program to implement anti-racism training for our Early Learning Center teachers. We also began to roll out P.R.I.D.E. Parent Village, an educational group for families who are raising students of color. Through these initiatives, we aim to ensure that our students grow up proud of who they are.

#### Dear Partner,

At YWCA Greater Pittsburgh, we aim to ensure that all women and girls in our community, especially those of color, have the resources and support they need to achieve their dreams. This may sound like a simple goal, but in reality it requires us to break down entrenched systemic barriers like racism and sexism. In other words, to achieve our mission, we need to dream big too. I'm pleased to say that what we have achieved at YWCA Greater Pittsburgh this year reflects some of the loftiest aspirations I had when beginning my role as CEO only four years ago, and I can't wait to see where we go from here.

In 2022-2023, we were thrilled to embark on several new mission expansion initiatives that highlighted our organizational value of stewardship and greatly expanded our mission impact in the region. In partnership with the Poise Foundation, we launched the Mission in Action grant program, awarding funds ranging from \$8,000 to \$94,000 to 17 local nonprofits working to eliminate racism and empower women.

In partnership with Catapult Greater Pittsburgh, we also launched a Sustainability Mini-Grant Program, **awarding \$5,000 to 11 women and minority women-led small businesses** serving Allegheny County.

Finally, we partnered with the African American Chamber of Commerce of Western PA, Asian American Chamber of Commerce of Pittsburgh, and Pittsburgh Metropolitan Area Hispanic Chamber of Commerce to provide one-time \$20,000 grants to support local MWBE business owners.

In the coming year, I invite you to join us in dreaming big for the women and families in our community. When we work together, there's nothing we can't accomplish.

Engaged 1,112 individuals with 27 events & trainings

YWCA Greater Pittsburgh co-creates and collaborates for greater impact. The Level Up Greater Pittsburgh Pay Equity Campaign added 3 new partners and translated the Pay Equity Pledge into 15 languages. The statewide Unite to Heal PA coalition started an all-new ambassador program and trained 11 new Unite to Heal PA Ambassadors to hold racial healing conversations in their communities.


